Central Glass Works (Wheeling, Pennsylvania) and Jeannette Glass Company (Jeannette, Pennsylvania) are two of the 'minor' companies that produced stretch glass.

Central appears to have used a single bowl mold, but shaped the mold into many forms. They also made two sizes of trumpet-shaped candle holders. Some of their pieces have gold glue-chip decoration.

In contrast, Jeannette used several bowl molds. They also made handled servers with unique handle shapes.

Both companies used a multitude of different colors.
